7. Contract description

The purpose is to help minimising the negative effects of the prison environment on the children living with their mothers in penal institutions by taking measures to support the physical, cognitive, emotional, social and educational development of these children and to reduce adverse impact on children whose parents are in the penal institutions.

In this context, the contractor will create daily life and educational programmes suitable to the age group of children staying with their mothers in the penal institution. In addition capacity of personnel at penal institutions and the women convicts and detainees will be developed and collaboration across relevant sectors will be increased with activities implemented by the contractor.

9. Maximum budget

EUR 780 000.

Conditions of participation

11. Eligibility

Participation is open to all natural persons who are nationals of and legal persons (participating either individually or in a grouping — consortium — of tenderers) which are effectively established in a member state of the European Union or in a eligible country or territory as defined under the Regulation (EU) No 236/2014 establishing common rules and procedures for the implementation of the Union's instruments for external action (CIR) for the applicable instrument under which the contract is financed (see also heading 29 below). Participation is also open to international organisations.

For UK candidates: please be aware that following the entry into force of the EU-UK Withdrawal Agreement(1) on 1 February 2020 and in particular Articles 127(6), 137 and 138, the references to natural or legal persons residing or established in a member state of the European Union and to goods originating from an eligible country, as defined under Regulation (EU) No 236/2014(2) are to be understood as including natural or legal persons residing or established in and to goods originating from, the United Kingdom. Those persons and goods are therefore eligible under this call.

12. Candidature

All eligible natural and legal persons (as per item 11 above) or groupings of such persons (consortia) may apply.

A consortium may be a permanent, legally-established grouping or a grouping which has been constituted informally for a specific tender procedure. All members of a consortium (i.e., the leader and all other members) are jointly and severally liable to the contracting authority.

The participation of an ineligible natural or legal person (as per item 11) will result in the automatic exclusion of that person. In particular, if that ineligible person belongs to a consortium, the whole consortium will be excluded.

13. Number of applications

No more than one application can be submitted by a natural or legal person whatever the form of participation (as an individual legal entity or as leader or member of a consortium submitting an application). In the event that a natural or legal person submits more than one application, all applications in which that person has participated will be excluded.

14. Shortlist alliances prohibited

Any tenders received from tenderers comprising firms other than those mentioned in the shortlisted application forms will be excluded from this restricted tender procedure unless prior approval from the contracting authority has been obtained (see practical guide — PRAG — 2.6.3.).

Short-listed candidates may not form alliances or subcontract to each other for the contract in question.

15. Grounds for exclusion

As part of the application form, candidates must submit a signed declaration, included in the standard application form, to the effect that they are not in any of the exclusion situations listed in section 2.6.10.1. of the PRAG.

Candidates included in the lists of EU restrictive measures (see section 2.4. of the PRAG) at the moment of the award decision cannot be awarded the contract.

17. Number of candidates to be short-listed

On the basis of the applications received, between four and eight candidates will be invited to submit detailed tenders for this contract. If the number of eligible candidates meeting the selection criteria is less than the minimum of four, the contracting authority may invite the candidates who satisfy the criteria to submit a tender.

Selection and award criteria

21. Selection criteria

The following selection criteria will be applied to candidates. In the case of applications submitted by a consortium, these selection criteria will be applied to the consortium as a whole unless specified otherwise. The selection criteria will not be applied to natural persons and single-member companies when they are subcontractors.

1) Economic and financial capacity of candidate (based on item 3 of the application form). In case of candidate being a public body, equivalent information should be provided. The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last 3 financial years for which accounts have been closed.

Criteria for legal and natural persons:

— The average annual turnover of the candidate must exceed EUR 500 000 in the reference period.

2) Professional capacity of candidate (based on items 4 and 5 of the application form). The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last 3 years preceding the submission deadline. Criteria for legal and natural persons:

— At least five staff currently work for the candidate in fields related to this contract.

3) Technical capacity of candidate (based on items 5 and 6 of the application form). The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last 3 years preceding the submission deadline.

Criteria for legal and natural persons:

(a) the candidate has provided services under a single contract/similar assignment with a budget of at least EUR 750 000 (proportion carried out by the candidate) in the field of education which was implemented at any moment during the following period: 3 years prior to the submission deadline of this application (the start and end/completion dates of the references should be specified as day/month/year);

(b) the candidate has provided services under a single contract/similar assignment with a budget of at least EUR 500 000 (proportion carried out by the candidate) in the field of child (aged between 0 to 6) development and care which was implemented at any moment during the following period: 3 years prior to the submission deadline of this application (the start and end/completion dates of the references should be specified as day/ month/year).

This means that the contract/assignment the candidate refers to could have been started or completed at any time during the indicated period but it does not necessarily have to be started and completed during that period, nor implemented during the entire period.

Candidates are allowed to refer either to contracts/assignments completed within the reference period (although started earlier) or to contracts/assignment not yet completed. In the first case the contract/assignment will be considered in its whole if proper evidence of performance is provided (statement or certificate from the entity which awarded the contract/assignment, proof of final payment). In case of contracts/assignments still ongoing only the portion satisfactorily completed during the reference period although started earlier will be taken into consideration. This portion will have to be supported by documentary evidence (similarly to contracts/assignment in a consortium, the percentage that the candidate has successfully completed must be clear from the documentary evidence, together with a description of the nature of the services provided if the selection criteria relating to the pertinence of the experience have been used. Documentary evidence is not required at the application stage but will be requested with the invitation to tender.

Previous experience which caused breach of contract and termination by a contracting authority shall not be used as reference.

An economic operator may, where appropriate and for a particular contract, rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them.

If the tenderer relies on other entities it must prove to the contracting authority that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for the performance of the contract by producing a commitment by those entities to place those resources at its disposal. Such entities, for instance the parent company of the economic operator, must respect the same rules of eligibility — notably that of nationality — and must comply with the selection criteria for which the economic operator relies on them. Furthermore, the data for this third entity for the relevant selection criterion should be included in the tender in a separate document. Proof of the capacity will also have to be provided when requested by the contracting authority.

With regard to technical and professional criteria, an economic operator may only rely on the capacities of other entities where the latter will perform the services for which these capacities are required.

With regard to economic and financial criteria, the entities upon whose capacity the tenderer relies become jointly and severally liable for the performance of the contract.

If more than eight eligible candidates meet the above selection criteria, their relative strengths and weaknesses must be re-examined in order to rank their applications and identify the eight best candidates in accordance with point 17 of this contract notice. The only additional comparative criteria that will be taken into consideration during this re-examination, in the order in which they appear below, are:

1) the highest number of service contracts that meet criterion 21.3.2,

2) the highest cumulated value of all the service contracts that meet criterion 21.3.2.

N.B.: additional comparative criterion No 1 shall be applied to all the eligible candidates that meet the selection criteria. If, after applying additional comparative criterion No 1, it is not possible to identify the eight best candidates because two or more candidates are tied for the eighth position, additional comparative criterion No 2 shall be applied only to these tied candidates.

23. Deadline for submission of applications

The candidate attention is drawn to the fact that there are two different systems for sending applications: one is by post or private mail service, the other is by hand delivery.

In the first case, the application must be sent before the date and time limit for submission, as evidenced by the postmark or deposit slip(3), but in the second case it is the acknowledgment of receipt given at the time of the delivery of the application that will serve as proof.

Any application sent to the contracting authority after this deadline will not be considered.

The contracting authority may, for reasons of administrative efficiency, reject any application submitted on time to the postal service but received, for any reason beyond the contracting authority's control, after the effective date of approval of the short-list report, if accepting applications that were submitted on time but arrived late would considerably delay the evaluation procedure or jeopardise decisions already taken and notified. (3) It is recommended to use registered mail in case the postmark would not be readable.
