7. **Contract description**
The aim of the contract is to support Ministry for EU Affairs (MEU) in its role as National IPA Coordinator (NIPAC) in stretching the scope of the Result Oriented Monitoring (ROM) established in Turkey out to the sectors eligible for the support of EU funds in IPA II through ROM missions to the on-going actions/activities with a view to ensure achievement of objectives at action and sectoral level (as specified in Indicative Strategy Papers) and ex-post ROM missions to the projects inherited from the IPA period.
To this end, the Contractor will provide services such as i) conducting ROM missions to the on-going projects as well as ex-post ROM missions to the completed projects from the IPA period and producing Monitoring Reports, ii) modifying the existing ROMIS-TR database of the MEU, iii) revising ROM Handbook for Turkey, iv) providing regular consultancy to the MEU in order to improve the effectiveness of the monitoring system in Turkey in line with the targets/structures defined under IPA II, v) revising Monitoring and Evaluation Chapters of the Manuals of NIPAC and Operating Structures and vii) organising trainings, seminars and workshops on ROM methodology.

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

11. **Eligibility**

Participation is open to all natural persons who are nationals of and legal persons (participating either individually or in a grouping — consortium — of tenderers) which are effectively established in a Member State of the European Union or in a eligible country or territory as defined under the Regulation (EU) N^o236/2014 establishing common rules and procedures for the implementation of the Union's instruments for external action (CIR) for the applicable Instrument under which the contract is financed (see also heading 29 below). Participation is also open to international organisations.

Please be aware that after the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the EU, the rules of access to EU procurement procedures of economic operators established in third countries will apply to candidates or tenderers from the United Kingdom depending on the outcome of negotiations. In case such access is not provided by legal provisions in force at the time of the contract award, candidates or tenderers from the United Kingdom, could be rejected from the procurement procedure.

12. **Candidature**

All eligible natural and legal persons (as per item 11 above) or groupings of such persons (consortia) may apply.

A consortium may be a permanent, legally-established grouping or a grouping which has been constituted informally for a specific tender procedure. All members of a consortium (i.e., the leader and all other members) are jointly and severally liable to the Contracting Authority.

The participation of an ineligible natural or legal person (as per item 11) will result in the automatic exclusion of that person. In particular, if that ineligible person belongs to a consortium, the whole consortium will be excluded.

13. **Number of applications**

No more than one application can be submitted by a natural or legal person whatever the form of participation (as an individual legal entity or as leader or member of a consortium submitting an application). In the event that a natural or legal person submits more than one application, all applications in which that person has participated will be excluded.

14. **Shortlist alliances prohibited**

Any tenders received from tenderers comprising firms other than those mentioned in the shortlisted application forms will be excluded from this restricted tender procedure unless prior approval from the Contracting Authority has been obtained (see Practical Guide – PRAG - 2.4.3.). Short-listed candidates may not form alliances or subcontract to each other for the contract in question.

15. **Grounds for exclusion**

As part of the application form, candidates must submit a signed declaration, included in the standard application form, to the effect that they are not in any of the exclusion situations listed in Section 2.3.3 of the PRAG.

16. **Sub-contracting**

Subcontracting is allowed.

17. **Number of candidates to be short-listed**

On the basis of the applications received, between 4 and 8 candidates will be invited to submit detailed tenders for this contract. If the number of eligible candidates meeting the selection criteria is less than the minimum of 4, the Contracting Authority may invite the candidates who satisfy the criteria to submit a tender.

SELECTION AND AWARD CRITERIA

21. **Selection criteria**

The following selection criteria will be applied to candidates. In the case of applications submitted by a consortium, these selection criteria will be applied to the consortium as a whole unless specified otherwise. The selection criteria will not be applied to natural persons and single member companies when they are sub-contractors.

1) Economic and financial capacity of candidate (based on item 3 of the application form). In case of candidate being a public body, equivalent information should be provided. The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last three years for which accounts have been closed.

Criteria for legal and natural persons:

1— the average annual turnover of the candidate must exceed 1 500 000 EUR.

2) Professional capacity of candidate (based on items 4 and 5 of the application form). The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last three years from submission deadline.

Criteria for legal and natural persons:

1— at least 5 staff currently work for the candidate.

3) Technical capacity of candidate (based on items 5 and 6 of the application form). The reference period which will be taken into account will be the last five years from submission deadline.

Criteria for legal and natural persons:

1— the candidate has provided services under a single contract or similar assignment with a budget of at least 1 250 000 EUR (proportion carried out by the candidate) in the field of monitoring and/or evaluation of projects/ programmes (that are not limited to grant schemes or programmes where only financial grants are made) which was implemented at any moment during the reference period: 5 years from the submission deadline (the start and end/completion dates of the references should be specified as day/month/year).

This means that the contract/assignment the candidate refers to could have been started or completed at any time during the indicated period but it does not necessarily have to be started and completed during that period, nor implemented during the entire period. Candidates/tenderers are allowed to refer either to contracts/ assignments completed within the reference period (although started earlier) or to contracts/assignment not yet completed. In the first case the contract/assignment will be considered in its whole if proper evidence of performance is provided (statement or certificate from the entity which awarded the contract, proof of final payment). In case of contract/assignment still on-going only the portion satisfactorily completed during the reference period although started earlier will be taken into consideration. This portion will have to be supported by documentary evidence (similarly to contracts/assignments completed) also detailing its value. If a candidate/ tenderer has implemented the contract/assignment in a consortium, the percentage that the candidate/tenderer has successfully completed must be clear from the documentary evidence, together with a description of the nature of the services provided if the selection criteria relating to the pertinence of the experience have been used.

Previous experience which caused breach of contract and termination by a Contracting Authority shall not be used as reference.

An economic operator may, where appropriate and for a particular contract, rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. It must in that case prove to the Contracting Authority that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract, for

example by producing a commitment on the part of those entities to place those resources at its disposal. Such entities, for instance the parent company of the economic operator, must respect the same rules of eligibility - notably that of nationality – and must fulfil the same relevant selection criteria as the economic operator. With regard to technical and professional criteria, an economic operator may only rely on the capacities of other entities where the latter will perform the works or services for which these capacities are required. With regard to economic and financial criteria, the entities upon whose capacity the tenderer relies, become jointly and severally liable for the performance of the contract.

If more than 8 eligible candidates meet the above selection criteria, the relative strengths and weaknesses of the applications of these candidates must be reexamined to identify the eight best candidates. The only factors which will be taken into consideration during this reexamination are:

The highest number of references fulfilling technical capacity criterion 21.3.1;

and for the cases of equality in line with the first re-examination criterion, the second re-examination criterion will be the cumulative value of the references (proportion carried out by the candidate) fulfilling the technical capacity criterion 21.3.1.

Best price-quality ratio.

Candidates may alter or withdraw their applications by written notification prior to the deadline for submission of applications. No application may be altered after this deadline.

Any such notification of alteration or withdrawal shall be prepared and submitted in accordance with Item 25. The outer envelope (and the relevant inner envelope if used) must be marked 'Alteration' or 'Withdrawal' as appropriate.
